Telephone Equipment Purchase Program & Much More on Assistive Technology!

Presenter: Laurie Flores; Director of Outreach & Technology at HEAR Wisconsin

For 95 years, HEAR Wisconsin, located in the Milwaukee area, has provided critical services to children and adults with hearing loss throughout Wisconsin. Its mission is to help infants, children, & adults by eliminating communication & language barriers through personalized services, technology, & education.



MS Flores will explain the Telephone Equipment Purchase Program (TEPP) that will provide a substantial voucher to people with severe hearing loss to purchase equipment that makes telephone use more accessible. Vouchers can be used for a cell phone, landline phone, etc. TEPP, a public service, has no income requirements.

She will also share information about the HLAAWI assistive technology demo center and the new MAC mobile hearing testing unit that was just established recently.

You will want to learn all you can about HEARWI, TEPP, MAC, and other services provided. We are grateful to MS Flores for presenting this program.

Were You With Us on March 14th?

A large group from all over Wisconsin joined us to watch "We Hear You: Now You Hear Us" at our March meeting. This documentary has received rave reviews & was awarded Best Film on Disability at the 2021 Cannes World Film Festival. It chronicles the challenges of our "invisible disability" through the experiences of four women across two continents who undertook the project to raise awareness of hearing loss & stop the stigma associated with it.

The hearing loss journeys of all four women, although quite different, shared one thing in common. They all credited HLAA for empowering them to "come out of their hearing loss closets." Their collaboration to create the documentary was their way of saying thank you to HLAA. They decided to pay it forward with the film & definitely achieved their goal.

Michelle Frisbie facilitated a discussion after the showing. Participants brainstormed about ways to promote this documentary. Options included viewing by community service groups, assistive living centers, ADRC offices, audiology colleges, film festivals, etc. The documentary furthers HLAA's mission to share information, educate, advocate and provide support to people with hearing loss.

Do you ever look back and remember how much you once loved going to the movies? Since I was very young, sitting on the floor watching the Ed Sullivan Show every Sunday night, I've been hooked on 'the screen'; the bigger the better! A barrier to enjoyment though, has been my progressive hearing loss that made it more and more difficult to enjoy them. Thanks to technology, there is a way*, and I am still hooked!

I always try to see every movie that has been nominated for the Oscars and other film awards too. I'm especially fired up right now about the movie CODA that is up for major Academy Awards, including Best Picture. CODA has already won the 'Best Film Award' from the Producers Guild, along with several SAG & BAFTA Awards. In fact it has already won 56 awards among 136 nominations. With that record, it has to be good!

CODA, which is a standard acronym for Children of Deaf Adults, is a heartwarming, tear jerking story of seventeen year old Ruby (Emelia Jones), who is the sole hearing member in a deaf family. Her life revolves around acting as an interpreter for her deaf parents (Marlee Matlin & Troy Katsur), and working in the family's struggling business. When she joins her school choir she discovers a gift for music with the opportunity to apply to a prestigious music school. She finds herself torn between the obligations she feels to her family and the pursuit of her own dreams. Matlin and Katsurr are both deaf themselves. Jones, is hearing and learned American Sign Language for her role in this film. They have all received rave reviews!

Screening for Hearing Loss in Primary Health Care Settings

HLAA supports the inclusion of a standardized approach to screening for hearing loss in primary health care settings that includes both a subjective and objective component in all adults during routine physicals; the "Welcome to Medicare" assessment; and Medicare annual risk assessments, that are done in primary care settings.

Be open about your hearing loss, and tell your providers about HLAA. We have materials you can share with them. Ask us for them. We will see that you get them.
