

On the contrary, our journey toward better hearing is a constant process, given that the technical advances are coming at us at an increasing rate. I know for certain that becoming involved in HLAA has been a real benefit to me and to those who have to communicate with me in my day-to-day activities.

February Meeting Summary... Our first meeting of 2023 was held on Zoom. It featured a webinar that explained some new Blue Tooth technology called 'Auracast'. This is a universal technology that will relate to 'receivers' of all kinds, including hearing aids, airpods, & other devices that bring sound direct from a sound source to a person using a device. Imagine this in airports, sports bars, and all venues where background noise interferes with sound clarity. While this sounds wonderful, it will likely not displace hearing loops & other tech we HH folks use in the near future. We must definitely keep our eyes, ears & minds open for the future of Auracast. Remember, 'speech to text' wasn't for real a decade ago. The meeting was well attended. Thanks for joining us!

What is GalaPro?

GalaPro is a free app you can download to your smartphone or tablet. It will let you see captions of a Broadway theater production during the performance, from anywhere in

the theater. It's designed not to bother others when you use it. Amazing tech! Fox Cities PAC was the first to install this technology in the Midwest. It is only available for the Broadway performances. **Download the app prior to attending. You can tune in once the play begins.**

FACT: Amazing technologies like those we share with you didn't happen by magic. They are there because HLAA advocated for them, & educates about them. Good reason to support HLAA!


Find hearing loops on Google Maps! Here's How.

Thanks to a joint effort by HLAA's Get in the Hearing Loop (GITHL) program and Google, we can now use the Google Maps App to find out if a hearing loop is available at a business or venue. Having easy access to hearing loop locations will hearing aid & cochlear implant users find communication access when they venture out in the world. GITHL committee members are helping Google Maps add loop locations to its database. They need your help to update information.

For now, the easiest way to find hearing loops is by using a smartphone, open a Google Maps listing, under the photos, scroll to the right to find the "ABOUT" tab. Then click on "About" and scroll down to reveal the Accessibility Attribute; if the facility offers an assistive hearing loop, it will be listed under details.
