"LIFE IS LIKE A SAFARI!"

(Traveling with hearing loss)



Join us for a captivating presentation by our very own HLAAFVC member, Michelle Frisbie. She will share her international

travel adventures, & amazing wildlife pictures from her recent African Safari adventure!

Michelle grew up with a mild high frequency hearing loss. She started wearing hearing aids in her twenties, and joined our local HLAA chapter, to help cope with her "new normal". As her hearing got progressively worse in her 30's, she explored cochlear implants after attending an eye opening National HLAA Convention in Seattle. She got her first cochlear implant in 2001 and a second one in 2016 – they have been life changing!

Michelle doesn't let hearing loss stop her from enjoying all that life has to offer, including adventurous travel! She has traveled the US (hiking National Parks and the Grand Canyon, boating the Mississippi, riding jeeps through the red rocks of Sedona AZ) and to many international destinations (Mexico, the Caribbean, Europe, Bali-Indonesia, and most recently to Africa). She will share helpful tips for traveling with hearing loss and ways to prevent vertigo when flying.

Michelle says "Life is like a safari, full of adventure, especially with the challenges that hearing loss brings". Join us and bring your travel questions to learn how to be a savvy traveler, despite having hearing loss. **You may also join us on Zoom. Link <u>HERE</u>**

In July, members of HLAA took a field trip to Options for Independent Living in Green Bay to tour Option's Accessible Showcase Model Home, and learned



a lot about the services Options provides, including advocacy, information & referral, peer support &



independent living skills training. Those who took the chartered bus to Options, met at the Bordini Center.

Option's house was very neat to see, with many things in the building being accessible for people with a variety of disabilities. We were able to connect to the hearing loop in their conference room to learn from Option's staff. We got to see different pieces of accessible technology in different "rooms"; living room, kitchen, & accessible bathrooms. More information about Options at:

Options has a display of amplified phones that can be tested, along with "smart home" technology. The kitchen and bathrooms were modified to show how people with limited mobility can modify their home to be more accessible. Staff at Options can assist people with hearing loss in selecting a variety of hearing assistive technologies, including that provided by the state's TEPP* program.

After the 2 hour tour of Options, we went to Kroll's restaurant to enjoy their fare. The majority of us enjoyed their classic hamburgers, & we were all given a special surprise blueberry cheesecake dessert! A big thank you to Kroll's for providing that yummy dessert.

Fox Valley Chapter's board has been looking at ways to make the HLAA experience available to more people.



Notice: Audiologists owe it to their patients to recognize cochlear implant candidacy & to provide them with the most current information available. Candidacy has changed recently to allow people with less profound hearing loss and/or single sided deafness to qualify. There is no upper age limit for cochlear implantation.

Medicare and most insurers cover cochlear implantation even through they rarely cover hearing aids. If you're struggling to hear even with powerful well fit hearing aids, ask about cochlear implants. You're welcome to participate in this chapter's CI support group. Bring your questions.
